
On November 5, 2007, the Court ordered the parties to again meet and confer regarding a search protocol to inspect the mirror-imaged hard drives of certain of WideBand Defendants'

computers. [See November 5, 2007 Memorandum Decision and Order Denying Motion for Entry of Search Protocol Order (“November 5 Order”), at 5, Docket No. 597]. In response to that order, counsel for ClearOne sent correspondence to WideBand Defendants’ counsel that, in the interest of resolving the issue without further dispute, ClearOne would agree to *WideBand Defendants’* last proposed version of the search protocol (with a few, minor additions). WideBand Defendants summarily refused ClearOne’s reasonable concession, placing additional, unreasonable demands on ClearOne.

ClearOne does not believe that any further efforts by the parties to decide on a search protocol will be fruitful, as ClearOne has now offered to accept all of *WideBand Defendants’* most recent proposed search protocol (with a few, minor additions). Accordingly, ClearOne submits this second motion for entry of a search protocol, which seeks entry of the WideBand Defendants’ last proposed protocol, with the exception of the few changes requested in ClearOne’s last meet and confer letter of November 20, 2007.
